Clearly state your controlling idea (thesis statement) **<WORK THE THESIS PREWRITING EXERCISE BELOW.>**

- fully support your central thesis with at least 3 body paragraphs that offer passionate reasoning, facts, and evidence for your viewpoint
- use word choices that appeal to the audience's logic, emotions, and sense of what is humanly right
- use transition words to smoothly connect sentences to one another
- construct simple and compound sentences following punctuation and sentence structure standards
- organize and develop your argument effectively
- close with a call to action that will influence the reader to agree with your position and make the changes you suggest
- restate the thesis in the conclusion
- use correct spelling, capitalization, punctuation, grammar, and sentences
